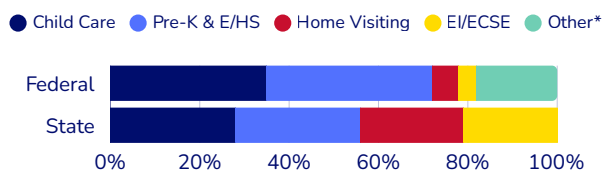


For every dollar spent on school-aged students in Indiana, \$0.10 was spent on infants and toddlers, and \$0.14 on preschool-aged children.

Indiana invested over **\$634 million** in early care and education in 2023. Of these investments in birth to kindergarten-entry:

- **45%** supported infants and toddlers and **55%** supported children aged three to kindergarten-entry.
- **80%** came from federal sources, and **20%** came from state funds.

ECE Spending by Program Type

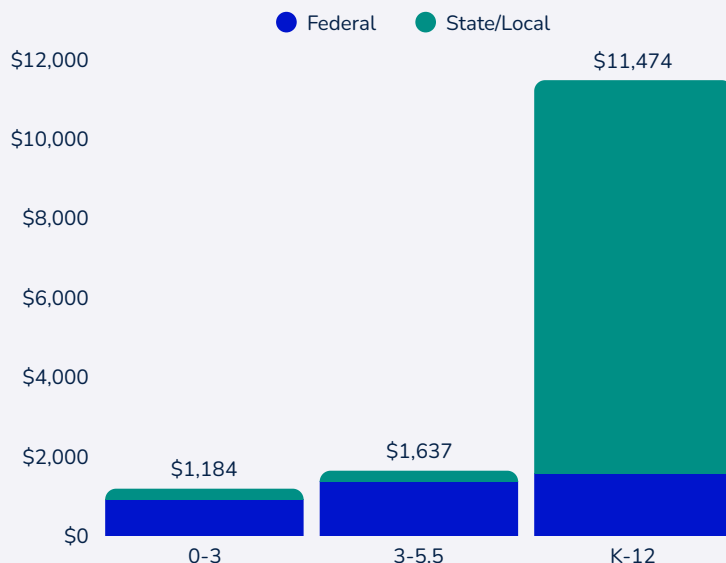


Between 2022 and 2023, Indiana increased state-specific spending on children from birth through kindergarten-entry by more than \$38 million.

In 2023, Indiana supported early care and education through dedicated programs such as the Office of Early Childhood and Out-of-School Learning and the Pre-K Education Pilot Program. Continued investments, such as an increase in eligibility for On My Way Pre-K, will be reflected in future reports.

*Other federal funding includes the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit (CDCTC), the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), and Child Care Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS).
