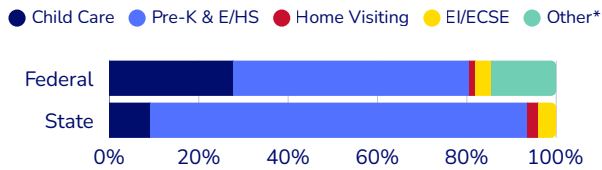


For every dollar spent on school-aged students in Michigan, \$0.08 was spent on infants and toddlers, and \$0.23 on preschool-aged children.

Michigan invested over **\$1.3 billion** in early care and education in 2023. Of these investments in birth to kindergarten-entry:

- **29%** supported infants and toddlers and **71%** supported children aged three to kindergarten-entry.
- **59%** came from federal sources, and **41%** came from state funds.

ECE Spending by Program Type

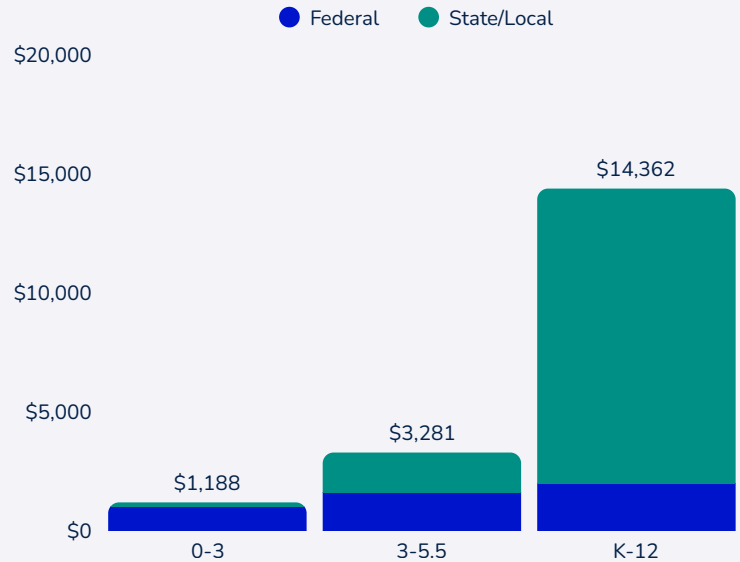


Between 2022 and 2023, Michigan increased state-specific spending on children from birth through kindergarten-entry by more than \$27 million.

In 2023, Michigan supported early care and education through dedicated programs such as the Great Start Readiness Program and the Child Development and Care Program. Continued investments, such as the PreK for All Initiative, will be reflected in future reports.

*Other federal funding includes the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit (CDCTC), the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), and Child Care Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS).
