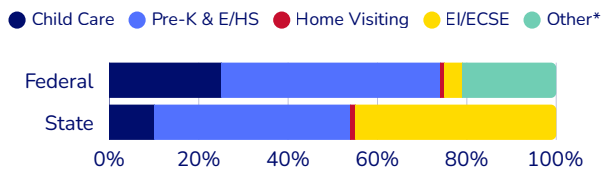


For every dollar spent on school-aged students in New York, \$0.06 was spent on infants and toddlers, and \$0.20 on preschool-aged children.

New York invested over **\$3.7 billion** in early care and education in 2023. Of these investments in birth to kindergarten-entry:

- **24%** supported infants and toddlers and **76%** supported children aged three to kindergarten-entry.
- **43%** came from federal sources, and **57%** came from state funds.

ECE Spending by Program Type

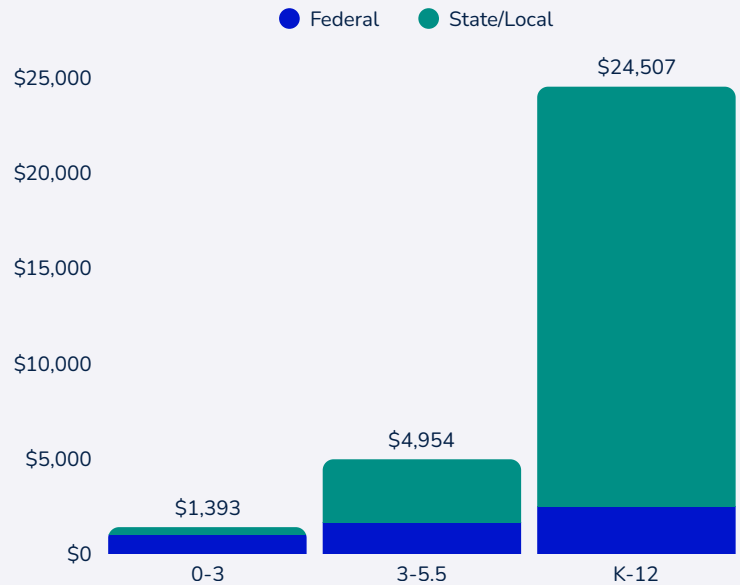


Between 2022 and 2023, New York increased state-specific spending on children from birth through kindergarten-entry by more than \$67 million.

In 2023, New York supported early care and education through dedicated programs such as Statewide Universal Prekindergarten and Home Visiting. Continued investments will be reflected in future reports.

*Other federal funding includes the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit (CDCTC), the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), and Child Care Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS).
