



For every dollar spent on K-12-aged students in Idaho, **\$0.10** was spent on infants and toddlers, and **\$0.13** on preschool-aged children.

In 2022, Idaho invested over \$124 million in early care and education, yet \$1 million – about 1% of total spending – was not reflected in national reports, leaving some state and local investments uncaptured.

Of these investments in birth to K-entry:


- 43% supported infants and toddlers
 - 95% came from federal sources
 - 5% came from state funds
- 57% supported children age three to kindergarten entry

In 2022, Idaho supported early care and education through dedicated programs such as the Idaho Child Care Program (ICCP) and Home Visiting. Continued investments will be reflected in future reports.
