

For every dollar spent on K-12-aged students in New Hampshire, **\$0.08 was spent on infants and toddlers, and \$0.09 on preschool-aged children.**

New Hampshire invested almost \$100 million in early care and education in 2022, yet only \$92 million of those dollars were reflected in national reports, leaving \$8 million – or 9% – of state and local spending uncaptured.

Of these investments in birth to K-entry:

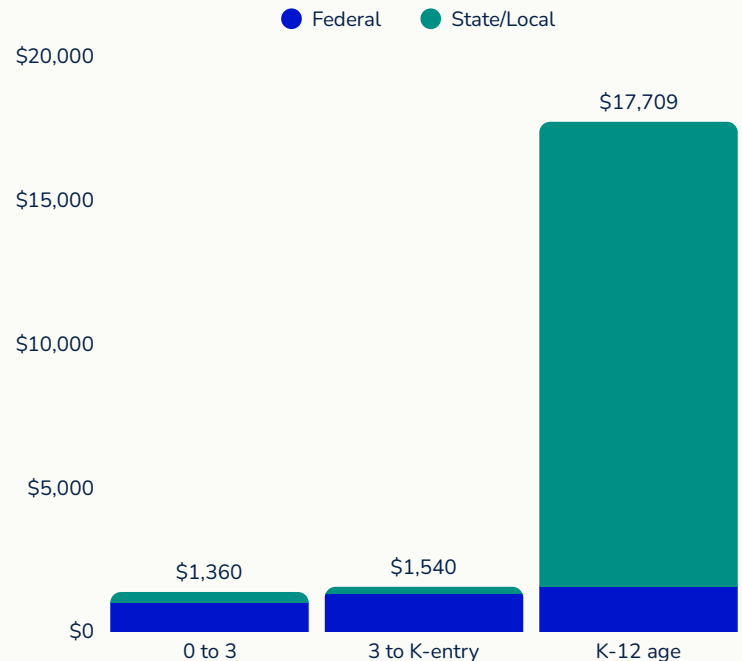
- 48% supported infants and toddlers
- 52% supported children age three to kindergarten entry
- 79% came from federal sources
- 21% came from state funds

In 2022, New Hampshire supported early care and education through dedicated programs such as the Child Development Program. Continued investments will be reflected in future reports.
