



For every dollar spent on K-12-aged students in New York, **\$0.05 was spent on infants and toddlers, and \$0.19 on preschool-aged children.**

New York invested almost \$3.5 billion in early care and education in 2022, yet only \$2.5 billion of those dollars were reflected in national reports, leaving almost \$1 billion – or 38% – of state and local spending uncaptured.

Of these investments in birth to K-entry:

- 24% supported infants and toddlers
 - 41% came from federal sources
 - 59% came from state funds
- 76% supported children age three to kindergarten entry


In 2022, New York supported early care and education through dedicated programs such as the Child Care Subsidies Program and Statewide Universal Prekindergarten Program (UPK). Future reports will capture New York's increased investments in these programs.
